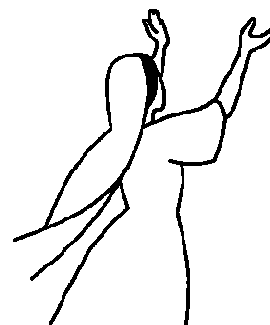
Glory and praise to our God

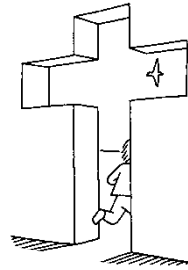
